

Aviation Education Programs

Scholarships: *There are three aviation scholarships available each school year. One is The Willard G. Plentl Aviation Scholarship in the amount of \$1,000 that is awarded to a Virginia high school senior who is planning an aviation career in a non-engineering area. Examples of non-engineering aviation careers include (but are not limited to) pilots, aviation maintenance technicians, aviation managers, etc. The second one is the John R. Lillard VAOC Scholarship in the amount of \$3,000 that is awarded to a Virginia high school senior who is planning a career in the field of aviation and must be enrolled or accepted into an aviation-related program at an accredited college. The third is the Virginia Aviation Business Association (VABA) Scholarship in the amount of \$2,000 and is awarded to any Virginia high school resident, technical school senior or college/university undergraduate that is pursuing a career in aviation at an accredited institution. Art Contest: *Each year there is an international aviation art contest held for those between the ages of 6 and 18 years old and three age categories which are broken down by the year you are born. The theme for the contest changes annually and gives students a chance to be creative as well as get some education about the theme and aviation in general. The contest begins statewide around the start of the school year and the deadline falls during the second week of January of the same school year. Teacher's Grant Program: *Teachers have the opportunity to instruct aviation related lessons and get reimbursed up to \$250 dollars each year. Photo Contest: *This contest is open to all ages and encourages participants to submit photographs of aviation-related activities in Virginia. Award winners will be featured in the Virginia Aviation Calendar, on the Department of Aviation's website, on the DOAV's blog 'Virginia Aviation News' and on DOAV's facebook and twitter sites. First, second and third place winners in each category will receive a certificate of recognition and a package of Virginia Department of Aviation and Virginia is for Flying Lovers logo items.
